Before applying for a Professional Review a candidate must have completed a Training Agreement or a Career Appraisal to demonstrate their initial professional development (IPD). The normal academic requirement for a potential Incorporated Engineer wishing to sit Member Professional Review (MPR) is a UK BEng in Civil Engineering or equivalent.

The National Research Council's Panel on Engineering Interactions with Society was formed to examine the functioning of the engineering profession in the context of, and in relation to, American society.
