The ICD-10-CM Official Guidelines for Coding and Reporting provide extensive notes and instruction for coding pain (category G89). Review these guidelines in full. The following summary identifies key points. When seeking a pain diagnosis, identify as precisely as possible the pain ' s location and/or source. If pain is the primary symptom and you know the location, the Alphabetic Index generally will provide all the information you need.

Pain-ICD-10-CM Coding—AAPC Knowledge Center

Code 338.3 is used to classify pain related to, associated with, or due to a tumor or cancer whether primary or secondary. This code is used as the principal code when the admission or encounter is for pain control or pain management. In this case, the underlying neoplasm should be reported in addition.

Coding Guidelines Pain – Category 338 Do not assign a code from subcategories 338.1 and 338.2 if the underlying (definitive) diagnosis is known, unless the reason for the encounter is pain control/management and not management of the underlying condition. Note: The term “ encounter ” is used for all settings, including hospital admissions
